INTRODUCTION

Reference Guide

PARTIES AND ELECTIONS IN EUROPE is a comprehensive reference guide to parliamentary elections, governments and political parties in the European countries:

- Basic data of more than 700 significant political parties: Founding years, political orientations, affiliations to political parties at European level, European Parliament groups, political internationals and other transnational organisations, websites.
- Chronological history of political parties: Origins, predecessors, historical predecessors, name changes, important mergers and splits [dissolved and minor parties without parliamentary representation are usually not listed].
- Parliamentary elections since 1945 [national parliaments; elections to upper houses in bicameral legislatures are not listed].
- Elections to the European Parliament since 1979.
- Governments since 1945: Heads of states, heads of governments, government parties (parties in cabinet) [acting office-holders, military rulers and office-holders in the former one-party states are usually not listed].
- Appendices: Regional elections and governments in autonomous regions since 1945 [regions with significant separatist movements; Åland Islands, Faroe Islands and Greenland are listed separately].

The country studies are usually divided into four main chapters:
