Introduction

Reference Guide

Parties and Elections in Europe is a comprehensive reference guide to political parties, parliamentary elections and national governments in all European countries since 1945:

- Basic data of more than 1250 significant political parties (currently active parties and dissolved or inactive parties): Founding years, political orientations, affiliations to political parties at European level (European political parties), European Parliament groups, political internationals and other transnational organisations, official websites [listed are parties with a representation in a national parliament or the European Parliament; minor parties without parliamentary representation are usually not listed].
- A chronological history of all significant political parties: Origins, predecessors, historical predecessors, name changes, important mergers and splits.
- Parliamentary elections since 1945: National parliaments of all European countries [elections to upper houses in bicameral legislatures are not listed].
- Elections to the European Parliament since 1979: Results on national and European level, memberships of national parties in the parliamentary (political) groups.
- Governments since 1945: Heads of states, heads of governments, governing parties (parties in cabinet) [acting office-holders and military leaders are usually not listed].

The country studies are usually divided into four main chapters:

A note on transliteration: The reference guide usually follows the scholarly system for the transliteration of Cyrillic. The names of office-holders were romanised according to the more familiar system used in daily newspapers.
